UP Assistive Technology Center



The **Assistive Technology Center** in the Upper Peninsula is a valuable resource to schools, non-profit organizations serving people with disabilities, and the medical community. The Center's staff is knowledgeable about and experienced in the use of dozens of assistive technology (AT) devices and programs. To choose the right device for the person, an AT assessment is conducted and then the person is matched with the AT and taught how to use it to address a specific task. The Center also trains area teachers and other professionals in AT assessment and use.
